

Child & Volunteer Protection Now And Into The Future

AYSO's Safe Haven® program protects its two most vital resources: players and volunteers. As part of this program, AYSO has implemented a number of initiatives to ensure child and volunteer protection.

The **Child and Volunteer Protection Advocate (CVPA)** is a required Regional Board position responsible for promoting and implementing Safe Haven Policies including:

- Collection and screening of volunteer applications from every volunteer each year.
- Checking Volunteer references.
- Ensuring that all AYSO Coaches and Referees are Safe Haven certified and trained.
- Maintaining Player/Youth supervision protocols throughout the Region.

In order to afford AYSO Volunteers maximum protection under the Volunteer Protection Act of 1997, AYSO requires all volunteers to:

- Complete and sign a Volunteer Application each year.
- Be authorized to carry out their job by the appropriate AYSO entity.



- Act within the scope of an AYSO job description and AYSO policies, guidelines and procedures.
- Be Safe Haven certified and trained.

Training and Certification is the only way to ensure the fulfillment of the AYSO vision and the protection of Volunteers and Players so AYSO requires that:

- All Coaches, Referees and Board Members be trained and certified.
- Practices & games may only be held with an AYSO trained and certified Team Coach.
- Official games may only be conducted with an AYSO trained and certified Referee.

Player and Youth Supervision

Protocols hold the Head Coach responsible for all players until they are picked up by the designated adult or otherwise leave the area as approved by parents or guardians. All AYSO activities require:

- One adult for every 8 or fewer children.
- A minimum of 2 adults present at all times.
- At least I adult must be of the same gender as the players.
- No adult should ever be alone with a child other than their own.
- A "Buddy System" of a minimum of 3 individuals.

For safety reasons, AYSO does not encourage allowing players to walk or bike home alone from practices or games.



AYSO, like many youth organizations today, asks adult volunteers to submit character references and agree to background checks in order to protect players, volunteers and Region resources.

AYSO's **National Background Check Policy** authorizes the National Safe Haven
Department to conduct background checks
and determine whether or not certain
convictions, particularly convictions involving
violence, crimes against another person or
substance abuse, should disqualify an individual
from volunteering with AYSO. The National
Background Check Policy is available online at

Safe Haven policies and **eAYSO**, AYSO's player and volunteer registration system, provide the highest levels of data security and encryption measures in order to secure volunteer personal identity information.

AYSO promotes Safety Awareness and Injury Prevention, requiring Regional Safety Directors and providing recommendations for goalpost and field inspections, severe weather contingencies, site emergency response plans and first aid kits.

Kids Zone encourages appropriate sideline behavior and **Codes of Conduct** for Coaches, Referees, Parents and Players, defining how to work, play and act in the AYSO family-friendly environment. Every AYSO venue is a Kids Zone.
